In addition to this, we had the blessing of having the wonder-working Icon of St. Anna from Philadelphia present with us for the entire pilgrimage. Fr. Athanasy of the Joy of All Who Sorrow Parish (ROCOR) accompanied the Icon which

comforted and consoled the entire community.

The Seminary had 18 graduates this year (among which was one of our own, the Riasaphore-monk Michael) bringing to conclusion the first year of our new and beloved Seminary Dean, Archpriest Alexander Atty. The Monastery, as always, offers its full support to Fr. Alexander and the Seminary community through our prayers and our pledge to teach, preach, and train traditional, balanced, and healthy priests for our Church while offering the greatest teaching tool the Church has: daily Liturgy and the full cycle of services at the Monastery Church.

Amazingly, we have also completed the desperately needed renovations to the Monastery which installed new energy efficient windows, insulation, sheet rock, new carpet, a new roof for half of the building, new septic pipes, some new plumbing, new electrical outlets for the rooms (finally, three prongs!), new kitchen cabinets and a fire system that brings the building up to the most basic code for our area of North Eastern PA. Thanks to the donations of the faithful, especially Dn. Michael and Mat. Arlene Pasonick as well as Behzad and Barbara Parhizgar, we were able to accomplish this immensely needed and difficult work in a short period of time. We cannot thank God enough for your support of this greatly needed project!



The Monastery continues to have many visitors (and we remind everyone that we have guesthouses for retreats and that you are invited to come to visit, stay and pray) as well as many prospective candidates for monastic life that hopefully will come back to stay in the future. The Brotherhood currently consists of 14 members: Bishop Tikhon (Bishop of Eastern Pennsylvania,) Abbot Igumen Sergius, Igumen Gabriel, Hieromonks Alexander and Innokenty, Hierodeacon Philip, Monks Nicodemus and Kyril, Riasaphore monk Michael, and the Novices Kenneth, Peter, Basil, Silouan, and Stephen. We are blessed to have each one, everyone providing services to the community,

offering their lives and talents to the Lord in this place to serve the Church.
